

The families and parents of these seniors were acknowledged for the part each played in helping these seniors achieve these accolades. Monetary scholarships were presented to many of these students.

The Brush Alumni Association was proud to be a part of this celebration, administrating 13 scholarships which, this year, totaled \$23.100! The first scholarship given by the Alumni Association was in 1993, when Mr. & Mrs. Alan Skinner and Mr. & Mrs. Don Lamberton (1947) classmates) established the John V. Jacque Memorial Scholarship. 2024 Wall of Achievement Induction Banquet



Brush Choir Alumni Reunion 1969-1978

Choir Alumni from the years 1969-1978 planned and attended a reunion on June 28-29, 2024. Fiftythree alumni and guests met in the Brush High School Commons for conversation, fun, food, and a spectacular performance by the Alumni Choir. Forty-two choir alumni prepared five selections for an evening performance at the close of the festivities. The singers had begun working on the music selections months earlier on their own and came together for rehearsals on Friday evening and Saturday morning. Our beloved choir director, Mr. Lindley Hall, was also in attendance and to our delight, conducted the group, bringing back fond memories of days and years spent loving choral music at Brush.



One of the selections revived by the choir was a **Beatles Medley**, originally arranged by *Dr. Steven* Schacter, M.D. (1973) for performance by Chamber Choir in 1972. Steve and Becky Ariemma Burrington (1973) collaborated to transform his 50-year-old hand-written score using technology and music writing software to make it more accessible to the singers. Ms. Candy Clemson (BHS Art teacher, retired) came up with the original banner painted for the performance 50 years ago and it was gloriously hung behind the Alumni Choir. *Evan Solomon (1976*) was the accompanist and *Terry* DiFranco Herschman (1973) co-directed the performance with Lindley Hall.

Local Alumni Business Spotlight ~ Lyndhurst Lumber

Lyndhurst Lumber has been a mainstay business in the South Euclid Lyndhurst Community for more than a century. Current owner Britt Raburn and his wife Paulette are Brush grads (1966 and 1968). They grew up respectively on Richmond Rd. and Biltmore Rd. Here is their story in a nutshell:

The company was started by three Telling brothers in 1921. In 1945, Paulette Raburn's grandfather and father, Paul J. Trumpp Sr., and Jr., purchased it as an adjunct to their business, Tru-Bilt Homes, Inc. That facilitated their supply chain as they built many homes in Shaker Hts. and Cleveland Hts.

Paul Sr. And Paul Jr. suffered untimely deaths and by 1975 Britt and his wife Paulette Trumpp made the decision to continue Lyndhurst Lumber. Britt had already received a master's degree from Bowling Green, served in the US Army and taught at Rowland and Ridgebury schools. Britt's leadership continued the family legacy and maintained Lyndhurst Lumber as a hallmark business in our community. His mother-in-law, Mary Trumpp, was the bookkeeper until 2000. Paulette meanwhile has taught for many years in the Willoughby Eastlake schools.

The facility, starting with the original well-constructed and ventilated building that had the exterior appearance of a red barn, through the years has evolved into the modern and full-service facility it is now.

Britt and Paulette live in Willoughby Hills but have continued to show their love for the SEL community. Customer service and satisfaction are always their top priority. Lyndhurst Lumber has helped and donated many times over the years. They donated all the supplies for the construc-tion of Humpal Baseball Field, located at Greenview Upper Elementary School. Britt is a true pillar of the community. We are very blessed by their presence here. Britt and Paulette's daughter, Jessica, and her husband Jim Mormino will soon carry on the great heritage of Lyndhurst Lumber., and testimony to their tag line.....HOMETOWN PRIDE!

Kicking off the 2024-2025 school year, the South Euclid-Lyndhurst staff members were treated to a welcome by 2002 graduate, *Roy Hall, Jr.* At Brush, Roy was a standout athlete, carrying a 3.8 GPA, and was honored as a first-team All-Ohio football and basketball star. He was nationally ranked as one of the he top-10 high school wide receivers. Following a college football career at The Ohio State University, Roy went on to play professional ball for the Indianapolis Colts, the New Orleans Saints, and the Detroit Lions.

Roy is currently a corporate motivational speaker focused on helping professionals master mental toughness, perform under pressure, and maintain motivation. During his years as a professional football player, Roy acquired an understanding of what it takes to not only inspire professionals to perform in high stress situations, but also what tools and strategies to provide them with to help neutralize challenges in the workplace that influence disengagement and low motivation.

Roy offered ten powerful, almost guaranteed ways, to have the best school year ever. With a little paraphrasing, these are tips we can all use...in our jobs, in our homes, in our lives...

- 1. Don't make it personal and don't take it home (don't take the negative from work home)
- 2. Schedule a once-a-month therapy session.
- 3. At least once per week work out at Arc Fit. (Brush's fabulous wellness/fitness facility)
- 4. Hand write short notes of encouragement to troubled students.
- 5. Write down what you're thankful for each day in your phone in a notes section.
- 6. Select a student to mentor for the entire year.
- 7. Stop counting down the days you have left & stop comparing our district to others.
- 8. Spend your lunch once every two weeks in the cafeteria with students or helping a colleague.
- 9. Go to a school or district function at least once a month and take your family if you can.
- 10. Don't ever talk negatively about a colleague or someone in the district.
